

BibleOne® v.7 Description

BibleOne® is a Bible Research Software to assist users in the following areas:



- + Studying Scriptures with Original Languages, i.e., O.T with Hebrew and N.T with Greek, and with their Readings tagged on each verse. Also, the Lexicons (Hebrew and Greek) are attached and viewed automatically together with grammatical and morphological information of each Bible texts.
- + Studying Scriptures with many historical commentaries, such as John Gills, John Calvin, Albert Barnes, Matthew Henry, Jameson Faucett & Browns, Biblical Illustrator, etc. All commentaries are synchronized with Bible verses, and can be viewed in separate windows.
- + Studying Scriptures with the emphasis on the “right” original texts, such as, all the Received (text) Bibles – Korean, English, Russian, Spanish, French, German, etc. and promoting the new translations of Received (text) Bibles in Chinese, Japanese and other languages.
- + Studying Textual Criticism in light of favoring the traditional text (“TR”) as opposed to the modern critical texts (Westcott-Hort, Nestle-Aland, UBS Editions). For analysis, many modern texts, over 10 Greek texts, can be collated in BibleOne® for anylisis. For this purpose, Bible text “compare” function was provided for a fast and effective comparative analysis.
- + Housing the newly-tranlated Received Bibles, (Korean, English, Spanish and Chinese), as it becomes available, with complete documentation, i.e., translation details, such as the original word-for-word mapping of the new translations.
- + Hundreds of Bible maps are integrated with the relevant Bible texts.
- + Also, In light of promoting good, Christ-honoring sacred music, the BibleOne® houses many music, including preludes (piano/organ), hymns and Psalters (Genevan and Scottish).
- + Automated updates/upgrades through Internet, whenever any part of the system upgraded/updated.
- + Major functions include:
 - Viewing Bible Texts (Hebrew/Greek/English/Korean/...Other 20 languages)
 - Hearing Bible Verses with Texts (Hebrew/Greek/English/Korean)
 - Viewing Commentaries along with Bible Texts
 - Viewing Lexicon Data along with Bible Texts
 - Viewing Textual Variations along with Bible Texts
 - Viewing Textual Kathib/Qere data with Bible Texts
 - Viewing Bible Maps with Bible Texts
 - Choosing language option (Eng/Kor) for Commentaries, Lexicon, Sacred Musics
 - Writing personal commentary/notes with Bible Texts

In the **Version.7**, major upgrades are –

- 1) BibleOne® on iUSB (Intelligent USB)
- 2) BibleOne® Audio on iUSB (Hebrew/Greek/English/Korean)
- 3) BibleOne® Biblitoria (“the house of books”)
- 4) BibleOne® ComX (Integrated Voice, Video and Screen Communications over Internet)
- 5) Automated Upgrade/Update through Internet

BibleOne® on 4G iUSB

iUSB is a USB device with intellegent firmware built in it, developed by XCELSOFT with help of a Korean USB manufacturer: www.YouNus.co.kr. The entire BibleOne® is now implemented on the 4GB USB, pre-installed and ready-to-run state. iUSB provides “intelligence” on the USB device (“U3” in case of San-Disk USB) with additional product security: “Non-COPYable” nature of BibleOne® software itself.

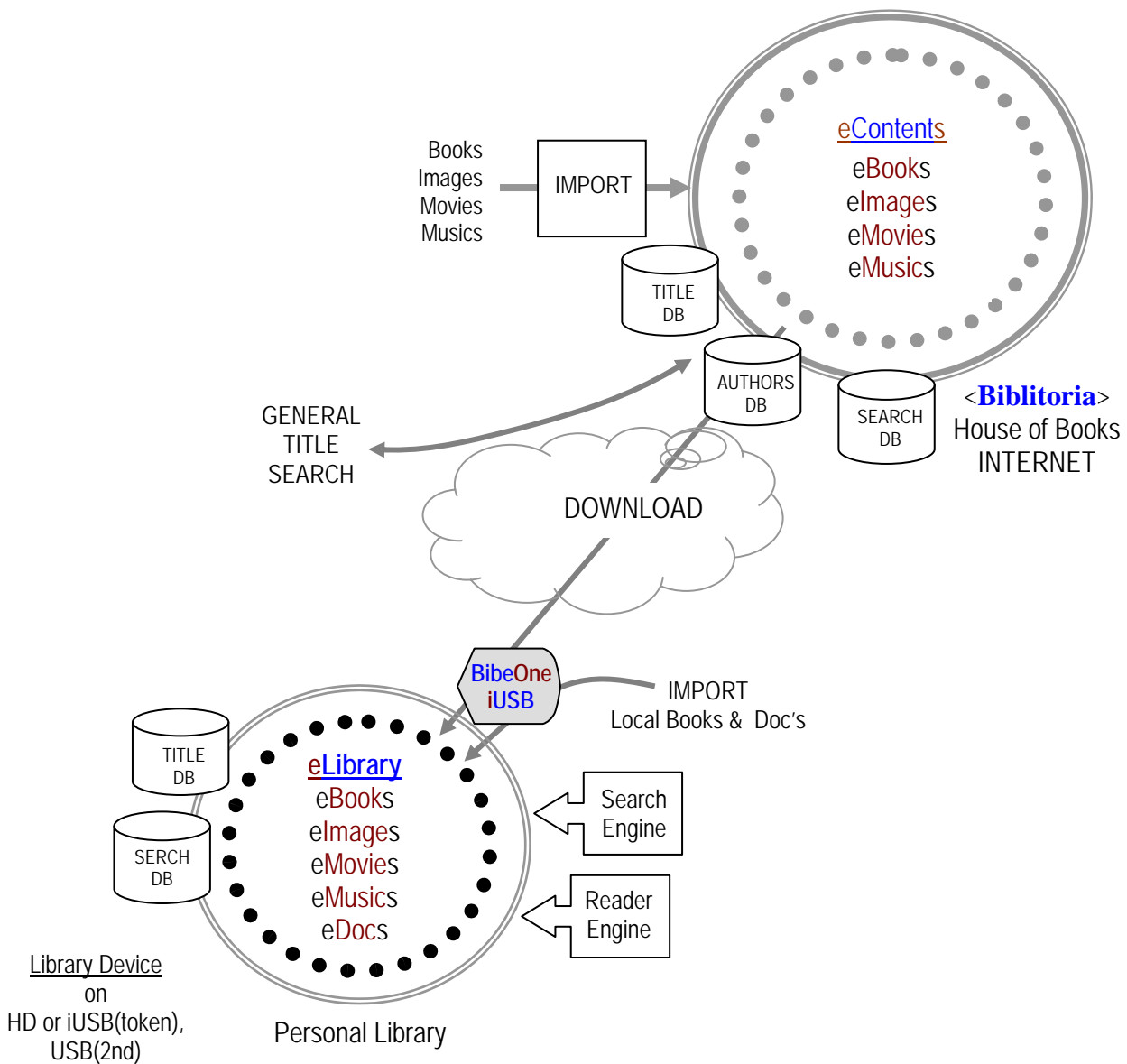
BibleOne® Audio on iUSB

Using 4G iUSB, we were able to have all Hebrew Audio files included on USB that user can hear the Hebrew reading while the text is being displayed on screen. This is true for some of Greek texts as well as English and Korean texts. Our goal is to make entire audio for Hebrew, Greek, Korean and English Received Bibles. The audio files can also be downloaded online automatically as they become available.

BibleOne® Biblitoria (“the house of eBooks”)

With the help of iUSB, we can now safely make all “eBooks” available online to BibleOne® users. The eBooks are “electronic books, secured in the Internet environment”. Now, hundreds of eBooks, eManuscripts, eSermons, eVideos can be made available securely to BibleOne® users without worrying about copy-right infringement. In fact, iUSB adopted the DRM(Digital-Rights-Management) concept to all eBooks in the BibleOne® server (“Biblitoria”). Initially, the following eBooks are ready to download:

- Codex Sinitcus, Codex Vaticanus, Codex Alexandrinus digital images
- Complutentian Polyglot (1514), Erasmus TR (1516), Stephanus TR (1550) digital images
- John Gill’s (1760), John Calvin’s (1557) Bible Commentaries
- John Calvin’s Institue of Christian Religion (1550)
- John Wylie’s History of Protestantism (1875)
- “Tabernacle” video (18 min, mp4)
- Over 40 Sermons on specific subjects, such as Textual criticism, Church history, etc.
- (many more)(By author’s request, some eBooks are not free-of-charge!!)



Notes on the DRM (Digital-Rights-Management) Feature of BibleOne® Biblitoria

From version 7, BibleOne® adopted a kind of “DRM” in providing the users access to any host eBooks so that the rights of the content providers can be protected, by making each eBook, once downloaded to a regitimate BibleOne® user in encrypted form, it becoms non-copy-able, non-save-able except being viewed only to the owner. This objective is achieved in the BibleOne® v.7 under iUSB and its host counterpart: Biblitoria.

BibleOne® ComX – Communications Centre

BibleOne® ComX is an independent communications software, performing peer-to-peer Voice, Video and Screen data communications over the Internet I.P. The BibleOne® host server acts as “connector” between two BibleOne® users. And maintains the current state of communications, such as I.P address and comm.status. Once a connection is established, a two-way walkie-talkie of Voice, Video and Screen continues until the end button is pressed. Users will have 3 requests for BibleOne® ComX Facility:

- Connection Request
- Screen-Write Request
- End Request
